

# Making Friends with Julie

Julie. She really is the most intelligent doll you've ever met. And now, she's *all yours*.

Julie will recognize words you say. *Secret words*. And she can "read" words and pictures in her books.

Plus, she knows when you take her places. And if it's hot or cold. Or light or dark. She even laughs when you tickle her.

Julie is so special that she's really more like a best friend than a doll. And because she's so special, there are a few things you need to know about talking to her and taking care of her.

So please read this Care and Instruction book carefully. Then try to keep it in a safe place in case you need it later. That way you can be sure you'll enjoy talking with Julie for a long, long time.

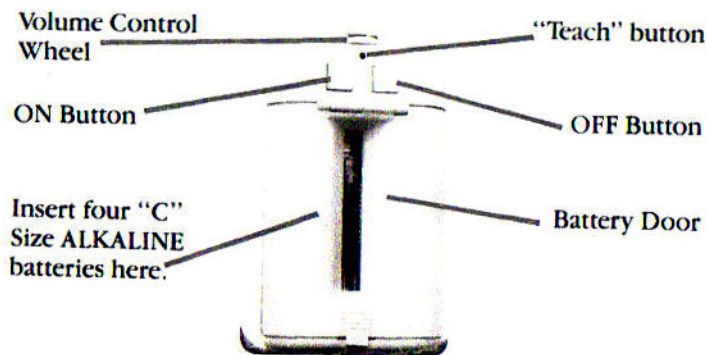
## Battery Installation & Care

Julie uses four "C" Size ALKALINE batteries. To insert the batteries:

1. Open the back of her clothing.
2. Open the battery door located on her lower back.
3. Insert the batteries as indicated on the label inside the battery casing.
4. Close the battery door.



NOTE: If Julie's batteries are getting low, she will say: "My batteries are low, please change them." When this happens, change her batteries.



## Turning Julie On and Off

Once the batteries have been correctly installed, you're ready to turn Julie on and start talking to her.

### To turn Julie On

Locate the ON/OFF buttons directly above the battery compartment. Then simply press the green ON button.

### To turn Julie Off

Just press the red OFF button.

If you forget to turn Julie off, don't worry. When you don't talk to her for a while, she'll say "See you later" and turn herself off.



# Adjusting Julie's Volume

You can easily make Julie's voice louder or softer. Here's how:

1. Locate the volume control wheel just above her ON/OFF buttons.
2. Turn the knob to the right to make her voice louder. Or to the left to make it softer.

# Julie's Secret Words

What makes Julie so different from any other doll is that she actually recognizes *certain words*—like “yes,” “no” and “hungry.” Plus, she recognizes *your particular voice*.

## Teaching Julie to know your voice.

First you have to teach Julie to “know” your voice. And it's best to do this in a **quiet** place. So that Julie can hear your voice very clearly.

Julie will ask you to say certain words. Like “Yes” and “No.” Then she'll ask you to say *Secret Words*. Like “Julie,” “Hungry,” and “Pretend!”

When this happens, simply face Julie and repeat the word she asks you for. If she can't hear you very well, Julie will ask you to repeat the word again.

Once Julie has told you all her Secret Words—and once you have repeated them for her—she'll remember how you said them.

## Always say “Julie” first.

Now that you have “taught” Julie to know your voice, she'll understand lots of *Secret Words* you say to her. But first you have to get her attention—which is why you must always say “Julie” first.

Here's how to talk to Julie:

1. Say “Julie” first to get her attention.
2. Wait for Julie to ask “Yes?”  
**NOTE:** If she doesn't ask “Yes?”, she may not have heard you. So say “Julie” again.
3. *Now* just say one of her *Secret Words* and listen to Julie talk about it.  
**NOTE:** If Julie doesn't talk about the *Secret Word*, say it again very clearly.

**REMEMBER:** If you want to change the subject—and talk about *another Secret Word*—you will have to get Julie's attention again by following the above steps.

## Teaching Julie to talk to your friends.

Because Julie has learned to recognize *your particular voice*, she may not recognize your friend or your parent's voice. But if you want to share Julie with your

friends or parents, they can “teach” her to recognize their voices too. It’s easy to do.

Also, if your voice sounds different for some reason—like if you have a cold—she might not recognize it. So you may have to teach her to know your voice again. It only takes a minute.

## Here’s how:

1. Locate the “TEACH” button *in between* the ON and OFF buttons.
2. Have a parent or other adult use a ball-point pen to press the “TEACH” button.
3. Repeat the words Julie asks you for as described above.



## More Things Julie Knows

Julie is so smart that she even knows when you’re taking her places. And she talks about it.

If you **pick her up or take her for a ride**, she might ask, “Where are we going?”

If you take her someplace **colder**, she may say “Brrrr, it’s getting colder.” Or if it gets **warmer**, she could say “Don’t you think it’s getting warmer?”

If you take her somewhere **darker**, she might say, “Can you see OK? It’s kind of dark.” But if you take her back into the **bright sunshine**, she may remark, “Gee, I wish I had sunglasses.”

And if you **tickle** her in just the right spot on her tummy, Julie will giggle.

## Reading with Julie

Another fun thing you and Julie can do together is play with her special sticker books. You can “read” together. Or play with all of Julie’s stickers.

There are over 50 stickers in all. And they’re reusable. So you can put them down, peel them off and move them around. Over and over again. There’s even a handy sticker pocket to keep them in when you’re done playing.

And when you’re ready to “read” with Julie, just look for the Magic Spots in her sticker book. The Magic Spots let Julie “read” words, name pictures and even play games.



## To make Julie "read"

Just take Julie's right hand and press the sensors on her middle fingers firmly on a Magic Spot. She will then name or talk about the word or picture. It's lots of fun.

## Voice Cards Make Julie Say and Do Even More

When you first bring Julie home, she says and does lots of different things—all by herself. But if you want her to say and do *even more*, you can buy special Julie voice cards that slip into a slot in her back.

With each new voice



card, Julie will talk about lots of new things. She'll have new secret words. And each voice card comes with a new sticker book filled with new Magic Spots and over 50 reusable stickers.

## Caring For Julie

### DOs and DON'Ts

- DO** say "Julie" *first*—before saying a *Secret Word*.
- DO** use only **alkaline** batteries.
- DO** make sure all four batteries are properly inserted.
- DO** keep the voice card slot free of foreign material.
- DON'T** take Julie into the bath with you. Water can severely damage her.
- DON'T** try to hold her eyes or mouth while she's talking.
- DON'T** expose her to excess heat by leaving her near a heating vent or on the back ledge of your car on a sunny day.
- DON'T** use excess force on the volume control wheel.
- DON'T** put anything other than a voice card into the voice card slot.
- DON'T** poke sharp objects into Julie's tummy because you could damage her speaker.

# What to do if...

PROBLEM	CAUSE	WHAT TO DO
Julie doesn't talk or move her mouth	Batteries not in right Julie is off	Check to make sure batteries are fresh and inserted properly Press "ON" button
Julie stops in mid-sentence or makes funny noises	Batteries low	Replace with 4 new "C" Size ALKALINE batteries
Julie's voice is hard to hear	Volume set too low	Adjust volume (See "Adjusting Julie's Volume")
Julie doesn't respond	Julie can't hear you	Talk louder or make sure you're facing Julie directly
Julie doesn't recognize Secret Words	You forgot to say "Julie" first to get her attention. She was not trained in a quiet place  <i>Your</i> voice sounds different for some reason It's too noisy	Say "Julie" first and wait for her to ask "Yes?" Then repeat Secret Word. Press the "TEACH" button and say the Secret Words again. (See "Julie's Secret Words")  Take Julie to a quieter place.
Julie talks too much.	It's too noisy.	Take Julie to a quieter place.
Magic Spots don't work right	Dirt on Magic Spot or on Julie's sensor fingers.	Clean Magic Spot or sensors on her fingers with a soft damp cloth You may also be using the wrong voice card with the wrong book

If you've reread all the instructions, checked every possible cause, inserted fresh batteries and still can't make Julie work right, she may need to be returned to us for repair.

## Keeping Julie Clean

Never immerse Julie in water, because it could seriously damage her mechanism.

To clean Julie, simply wipe her off with a damp cloth. For serious stains, you may use a little soap.

Handwash Julie's clothes in warm water with mild detergent and lay flat to dry.

## Cleaning Sticker Activity Books & Stickers

To clean Sticker Activity Books or stickers, simply wipe them with a slightly dampened cloth.
